Mac OS X 10.6 - Run OnyX

Follow these instructions when you have printing problems, when you can't open or delete files, or when you are experiencing other problems with a Mac. If the problem continues, please email the HSC HelpDesk.

1. The first time you open **OnyX**:

Click AGREE in the Software License Agreement window. (You'll make a change in a minute so this won't appear again.)

Each time you open **OnyX**, you will be prompted to check the S.M.A.R.T. status of your hard drive; click **Continue**. When finished, you will be prompted to verify the startup volume; click **Continue**. This can take several minutes. When finished, enter your OS X password when prompted. A window appears with Important information; close the window by clicking the red dot in the upper left corner of the window. (You'll make a change in a minute so this won't appear again.)

2. Before running **OnyX** the first time:

You need to make some one-time changes. Pull down the **OnyX** menu to select **Preferences...**. Click on the **Behavior** tab. Select **All Accounts**. Select **Automatically restart**.

Click on Messages and Log. For At launch:, uncheck both items.

Close the Preferences window by clicking the red dot in the upper left corner. Click **Parameters** in the Toolbar.

Click on the General tab. Set Speed of display of sheets: to Fast.

Click on the **Dock** tab. Set **Minimize Using:** to **Suck Effect**. Click **Continue**; the **Dock** will relaunch.

Click **Automation** in the Toolbar. Check all boxes *except* **Execute Maintenance Scripts**, since these are now done automatically. Quit **OnyX**.

3. How to run **OnyX**:

Quit all applications. Don't just close the window, but File > Quit each application.

Open **OnyX**; check the S.M.A.R.T. status, verify the startup, and enter your OS X password; click **Automation**, and then click **Execute**. **OnyX** takes about 15 minutes, so plan accordingly. When finished, your computer should automatically reboot.

Note: Running **OnyX** will alphabetize the contents of your Desktop. (So, don't clutter your Desktop!)

- 4. Once you're logged in, restart your Mac. As soon as you hear the startup chimes, hold down the **p**, **r**, **option**, and **command** keys until you hear the startup chimes four more times; release the keys.
- 5. As soon as you hear the startup chimes, immediately hold down the **shift** key. When you see the **Apple** menu and then the spinning icon, release the **shift** key. If a login window appears, enter your password, hold down the **shift** key, and click Log in; continue to hold the **shift** key until all icons appear in the menu bar; release the **shift** key. Restart your Mac. When you're logged in, restart your Mac one more time.
