

Talent Show Participation

Sumo Wrestling

When:

July 17, 2013

Roster:

Minimum 3 players from each advisory college

Points Awarded for Each College:

50 points for first place

40 points for second place

30 points for third place

20 points for fourth place

10 points for fifth places

5 points for sixth place

First through Six Place Ranking

Ranking is done by overall win-loss-tie record by percentage. The tie-breaker goes to the team with most games won in their matches. If a tie is not resolved with the tiebreaker, then the points will be divided among the teams.

For example,

3 teams tied for first place share 1st-3rd place points (50+40+30=120) equally so they each receive 40 points.

Format:

- Three match round robin.
- Each match is a best-of-three game format
- Random draw for opponents done prior to orientation week
- Referee from vendor determines winner for each game
- One minute time limit per game
- If neither player wins within one minute the game is a draw

Other Rules

Team must compete in all three matches to earn points

Human Foosball

When:

July 17, 2013

Roster:

Minimum 6 players

Points Awarded for Each College:

50 points for first place

40 points for second place

30 points for third place

20 points for fourth place

10 points for fifth places

5 points for sixth place

First through Six Place Ranking

Ranking is done by best overall win-loss-tie record. The tie-breaker goes to the team with highest points scored in all their games. If a tie is not resolved with the tiebreaker, then the points will be divided among the teams.

For example,

3 teams tied for first place share 1st-3rd place points (50+40+30=120) equally so they each receive 40 points.

Format:

- Each team will play three games each against opposing advisory colleges.
- The team with the most goals at the end of the match wins. A tie will be awarded if the score is tied.
- Matches are 10 minutes in duration
- Referee decisions are final.

Other Rules

Team must compete in all three matches to earn points

Wii Sports Tennis

When:

July 17, 2013

Roster:

Minimum 3 players from each advisory college

Points Awarded for Each College:

30 points for first place

25 points for second place

20 points for third place

15 points for fourth place

10 points for fifth places

5 points for sixth place

First through Six Place Ranking

Ranking is done by win-loss record by match.

For example,

3 teams tied for first place share 1st-3rd place points ($30+25+20=75$) equally so they each receive 25 points.

Format:

- Each player plays one side of wii Sports Tennis
- Best of 3 games wins match

Medical Family Feud

When:

July 18, 2013

Roster:

Minimum 5 players from each advisory college for each game

Points Awarded for Each College:

70 points for first place

60 points for second place

50 points for third place

40 points for fourth place

20 points for fifth places

10 points for sixth place

First through Six Place Ranking

Ranking is done by overall points after three rounds.

For example,

3 teams tied for first place share 1st-3rd place points (70+60+50=120) equally so they each receive 60 points.

Format:

- Three game round robin. Opponents will be determined prior to orientation week.
- First game is 100 points (5 possible answers)
- Second game is 200 points (5 possible answers)
- Third game is 300 points (3 possible answers)
- Categories are kept confidential
- Each college will select a member to participate in beginning of the game
- The emcee will read a category. The first to hit the buzzer will be given the opportunity to enter answer.
- If the first player to give an answer is incorrect or does not provide the top answer, then the emcee defers to the other representative to provide an answer. If the other player's answer is incorrect or ranked lower than the first answer, then the team that answers first is given the option to play or pass. Should the second team submit answer ranked higher than the first team to respond, they will have the option to play or pass.
- Each player on the team in order will be required to give one answer for the board.
- A team that decides to pass will allow the opposing team to complete all the answers. If that team is unable to, then the second team will be given the opportunity to steal the board by providing a correct response. If the

team attempting to steal is unsuccessful, then the initial team wins the game.

- A team that decided to play will be allowed to complete all the responses. If they are successful before three strikes, the team wins the points on the board. Upon the third strike, the other team will be given the opportunity to steal the board.
- No references can be used including books, journals, internet access, ipads, smart phones, etc.

American Heart Association Heart Walk

When:

September 7, 2013

Roster:

All students in their respective advisory college and are in good academic standing. Advisors, spouses, siblings, families may also participate.

Participation Points Awarded for Each College:

10%-20%=40 points

21%-30%=60 points

31%-40%=80 points

41%-50%=100 points

50%+1=110 points

What counts towards participation?

Participation counts as any first or second year member of the advisory college signs up for their team. Advisors, spouses, siblings, families may also participate.

Percentages will be determined by the number of participants divided by the eligible roster of participants. For example, if advisory college X has 95 first and second year students in good standing and 5 on probation, then 90 will be the divisor (the divisor will only be the total census of first and second year students). If an advisory college earns 60 participation points, then the allocation will be:

$60/90=67\%$ which will give advisory college X is awarded 110 points

Advisory Colleges earn participation by two means:

First: Financial

Each advisory college earns one participation for each \$10 raised. So if an advisory college raises \$400 on the AHA web site they receive 40 participants.

Second: Walk the Walk

Advisory colleges earn a participation point for each person who comes to walk regardless of how much money he or she raised.

The final census count will be conducted by September 10, 2013

DO Dash

When:

October 12, 2013

Roster:

All students in Years One and Two in their respective advisory college. Advisors, spouses, siblings, families may also participate for participation points but not in race points.

Participation Points Awarded for Each College:

10%-20%=40 points

21%-30%=60 points

31%-40%=80 points

41%-50%=100 points

50%+1=110 points

Racing Points Awarded for Each College:

50 points for first place team

40 points for second place team

30 points for third place team

20 points for fourth place team

10 points for fifth place team

5 points for sixth place team

What counts towards participation?

Participation counts as any member in academic good standing of the advisory college signs up for their team. Advisors, spouses, siblings, families may also participate.

Percentages will be determined by the number of participants divided by the eligible roster of participants. For example, if advisory college X has 95 first and second year students in good standing and 5 on probation, then 90 will be the divisor (the divisor will only be the total census of first and second year students). If an advisory college earns 60 participation points, then the allocation will be:

$60/90=67\%$ which will give advisory college X is awarded 110 points

How are racing points allocated?

Scoring will be done using cross country scoring. The top three race times by students in each advisory college will be ranked 1-18. Points will be allocated by position. The lowest score is first place and each subsequent score determine 2nd through 18th place.

Bowling Competition

When:

February 2013 or TBD

Roster:

Minimum 4 players

Points Awarded for Each College:

60 points for first place

50 points for second place

40 points for third place

30 points for fourth place

20 points for fifth places

10 points for sixth place

First through Six Place Ranking

Ranking is done by best score overall and each place is awarded subsequently.

For example,

3 teams tied for first place share 1st-3rd place points (60+50+40=150) equally so they each receive 50 points.

Format:

- Each team will get one lane.
- Each team will have four bowlers per game
- Each team will bowl two games
- Total score for the entire team will be submitted.

Other Rules

Rulings from the bowling alley are final.

Karaoke Competition

When:

Spring 2014

Roster:

No minimum requirement

Points Awarded for Each College:

60 points for first place

50 points for second place

40 points for third place

30 points for fourth place

20 points for fifth places

10 points for sixth place

First through Six Place Ranking

Ranking is done by best score overall and each place is awarded subsequently.

For example,

3 teams tied for first place share 1st-3rd place points ($60+50+40=150$) equally so they each receive 50 points.

Format:

- Each advisory may submit up to three acts. They may be solo or group performances.
- Acts are judged by panelists for talent (10 points) and choreography (10 points).
- Judges decisions are final

Other Rules

Each act must use music that is in the catalog of the karaoke service.

Talent Show Competition

When:

Spring 2014

Roster:

No minimum requirement

Points Awarded for Each College:

50 points for each instance

First through Six Place Ranking

No rankings. This may be repeated

Format:

- Each advisory college may submit as many acts they wish to be performed at the discretion of the show sponsors.

Other Rules

A good faith effort needs to be performed for the act. Acts are subject to the approval of the talent show sponsors.
