





What are career readiness skills?

The University of North Texas Health Science Center at Fort Worth identifies six Career Readiness Skills – also known as "Marketable Skills" – that are highly valued by employers and can be applied in a variety of professional settings. Mastering the following skills indicates you have developed attributes that broadly prepare you to successfully transition from student to professional.



COMMUNICATION

Articulate thoughts and ideas clearly and effectively in written and verbal communications.

Confident public speaking skills, able to express ideas to others, and can write/edit memos, letters and complex reports clearly and effectively.



INTERPROFESSIONAL TEAMWORK

Build collaborative relationships with colleagues representing diverse backgrounds and viewpoints with the ability to negotiate and manage conflict.

Work effectively within a team structure comprised of individuals from different disciplines with shared values in order to provide an integrated and cohesive approach to problem solving and patient care.



PROBLEM SOLVING

Exercise sound reasoning to analyze issues, make decisions and overcome problems.

Obtain, interpret, and use knowledge, facts and data in this process, and may demonstrate originality and inventiveness.

> Generate new ideas and creative thoughts.



LEADERSHIP

Demonstrate personal accountability and effective work habits, such as punctuality, working productively with others and time workload management, and understand the impact of nonverbal communication on professional work image.

Strong commitment to integrity and ethical behavior, act responsibly with the interests of the larger community in mind and able to learn from mistakes.



RESILIENCY

Adapt well in the face of adversity, trauma, tragedy, threats or significant sources of stress.

Adept at mentally and emotionally managing crisis situations and able to quickly "bounce back" from difficult experiences such as family and relationship problems, serious health problems, academic difficulties and/or financial stressors.



INTERCULTURAL FLUENCY

Value, respect, and learn from diverse cultures, races, ages, genders, sexual orientations and religions.

Demonstrate an openness, inclusiveness, sensitivity and the ability to interact respectfully with all people and understand individuals' differences.






