

## 15.620 SPH-Quality of Work Required

Students must make satisfactory progress toward completion of degree requirements. Unsatisfactory progress is defined as:

- Obtaining a grade of F in any course attempted;
- Having a cumulative GPA below 3.0;
- Withdrawal from 3 or more courses in an academic year;
- Withdrawal from the same course more than twice;
- Carrying more than 2 incompletes in an academic year;
- Not maintaining continuous enrollment;

MPH students enrolled in thesis and PhD students enrolled in dissertation are required to demonstrate that they are making satisfactory academic progress toward the completion of their thesis or dissertation. Satisfactory academic progress will be determined by the thesis or dissertation committee. If a student receives an unsatisfactory “U” grade two times, the student may be subject to dismissal from the program.

Application:

Policy applies to all students enrolled in the School of Public Health

Procedures and Responsibilities:

1. Audit student records to determine students for probation/dismissal.

Responsible Party: Office of Admission and Academic Services

2. Notify students of probation/dismissal.

Responsible Party: Office of the Registrar

3. If a student is dismissed from the program, refer to policy 15.615 SPH-Probation and Dismissal.
4. If a student files an appeal to the dismissal, refer to policy 15.618 SPH-Grade Appeal Policy and Procedures.
