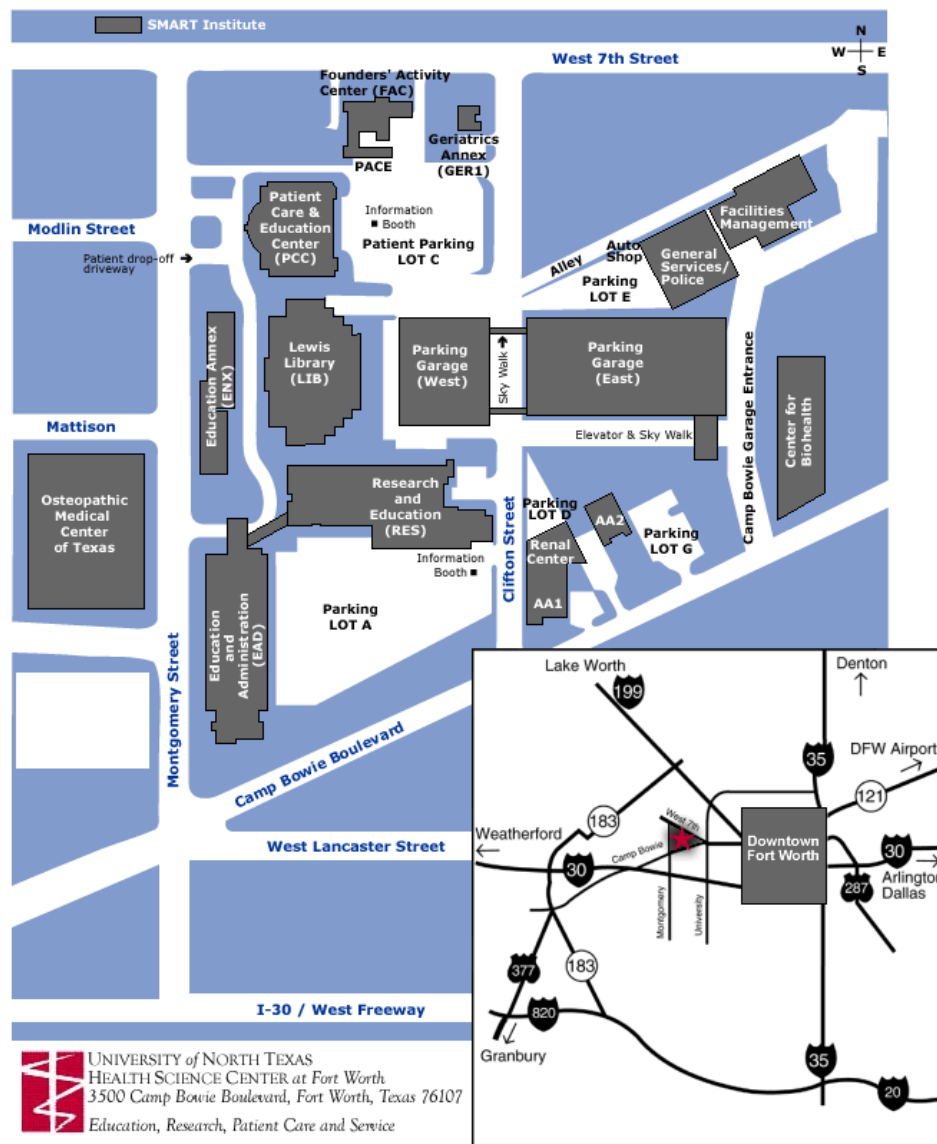

Financial Policies

UNT Health Science Center at Fort Worth is a state-supported institution and, as such, is subject to state laws. Since state law prohibits the extension of credit, all financial obligations to the health science center must be made when due. The health science center cannot cash checks made payable to both the institution and the student. Such checks can be applied to a student's account balance after obtaining the proper endorsement.

Tuition and fees are subject to increase and decrease by action of the Texas Legislature and/or the Board of Regents of UNT Health Science Center.

Students are responsible for any additional amounts due the health science center resulting from post audits and corrections, including all fees and waivers; i.e. registration assessing errors, changing from off-campus to on-campus classes, invalid employment waivers, etc.

It is the policy of UNT Health Science Center at Fort Worth not to discriminate on the basis of sex, race, color, religion, age, national origin, handicap, disabled veteran or veteran of the Vietnam era status in its educational programs, activities, admissions or employment policies.

The UNT Health Science Center at Fort Worth does not discriminate on the basis of an individual's disability and complies with Section 504 and Public Law 101-336 (Americans With Disabilities Act) in its admissions, accessibility, treatment and employment of individuals in its programs and activities.

Applying for Financial Aid

1. New applicants should complete a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) electronically via the Internet at www.fafsa.ed.gov. You will need a computer with access to a printer and your previous year's tax information. A paper FAFSA can be submitted instead but takes longer to process.

For renewing applicants, find your electronic access code (EAC) at www.eac.ed.gov. Then proceed to www.fafsa.ed.gov to complete a renewal FAFSA.

2. The Financial Aid Office does not have deadlines in which to apply. However, we highly recommend that you submit your application by April 1st if you are a continuing student and by May 1st if you are a new student to UNTHSC. The Financial Aid Office cannot guarantee to have your financial aid funds ready for you by the start of the school year if these dates are not met. Therefore, students who file applications after the recommended dates should be prepared to pay for their own expenses and wait until their aid dollars arrive to be reimbursed.

3. If you are selected for verification, additional financial aid forms will be required. If the selected data is incorrect, the processing time can increase.

4. Take adequate time to complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid. Read and answer all questions carefully and accurately. The additional time you spend in completing the application will enhance and ensure a successful application process.

5. Schedule an appointment with a financial aid counselor to discuss eligibility requirements, verification problems, budgeting of resources, or loan applications. Call (817) 735-2505 or (800) 346-8266 to schedule an appointment. E-mail may be sent to finaid@hsc.unt.edu.

Tuition and Mandatory Fees (§ 54.008)

The UNT Health Science Center Board of Regents has been granted the authority, within established guidelines, to set tuition rates by program.

Tuition and fees are subject to change according to the actions of the Texas State Legislature or the Board of Regents and are effective when enacted.

All fees listed in this bulletin are subject to change.

Statutory Tuition (§ 54.051)

Statutory tuition rates are set by the Legislature. Tuition generated from statutory tuition must be deposited in the State Treasury and expenditures from these funds are subject to state expenditure guidelines.

Designated Tuition (§ 54.0513)

Designated tuition allows the institution to determine the rate per semester credit hour to be charged. Designated tuition is charged in addition to the statutory and board authorized tuition. Designated tuition must be used to support the academic mission of the institution but maintains more flexibility than statutory tuition. Designated tuition rates must be approved by the Board of Regents.

Board Authorized Tuition (§54.008)

Board authorized tuition must be approved by the governing board of the institution. It cannot be higher than the statutory rate.

Paying Tuition

by Installment (§ 54.007)

UNT Health Science Center shall provide for the payment of tuition and fees during the fall and spring semesters through the following alternatives:

Full payment of tuition and fees upon registration or by the payment deadline for early registration; or

One-half payment of tuition and fees upon registration, or by the payment deadline for early registration, with separate one-fourth payments prior to the sixth and 11th class weeks.

NOTE: All course-related and optional fees are paid with the initial installment payment including the non-refundable handling fee of \$15.00. (This fee is charged to all medical students.)

Fee Waivers (§ 54.201)

Several exemptions and waivers are available to qualifying students. Brief descriptions of these are listed below. Waiver refunds must be requested during the semester application is made. Such requests must be made before the 12th class day in long semesters and the fourth class day in summer terms. Requests for retroactive refunds cannot be honored.

Exemptions and Waivers

1. Certain veterans, dependents, etc., of the U.S. armed forces are exempted from payment of tuition.
2. Certain orphans of members of the U.S. armed forces, Texas National Guard and Texas Air National Guard are exempted from payment of tuition.
3. Deaf or blind students are exempted from payment of tuition.
4. Children of disabled firemen, peace officers, employees of the Texas Department of Corrections and game wardens are exempted from payment of tuition.

5. Children of U.S. prisoners of war or persons missing in action are exempted from payment of tuition.

6. Resident rather than non-resident tuition is applied to certain students from other nations of the American hemisphere.

7. Resident rather than non-resident tuition is applied to teachers and professors of Texas state institutions of higher education, their spouses and their children.

8. Resident rather than non-resident tuition is applied to a teaching or research assistant provided the student is employed at least one-half time by the health science center in a position that relates to the degree sought. This also applies to the student's spouse.

9. Resident rather than non-resident tuition is applied to a non-resident holding a health science center competitive academic scholarship of at least \$1000 for the academic year or summer for which the student is enrolled.

10. Students who are concurrently enrolled in more than one public institution of higher education in Texas are not charged duplicate fees.

11. Certain health science center fees are waived for students enrolled only in off-campus courses.

Explanation of Fees

(Compulsory Fees)

Student Service Fees (§ 54.503)

Student service fees are assessed to cover the cost of student services that directly involve or benefit students, including but not limited to, recreational activities, lecture series and student government. Fees run from \$15-\$118 per semester with a maximum of \$354 per year.

Activity Center (§ 54.503)

A \$25/sem or \$75/year fee is collected for the maintenance and operation of the Founder's Activity Center.

Library (§ 54.503)

A \$50/sem or \$150/year fee collected for the maintenance and upgrades of facilities and computer labs.

(Initial Enrollment Fees)

**Collected from all students during initial semester of enrollment*

ID Card Fee (§ 54.504)

A \$25 ID card fee is collected from each student during the first semester of enrollment to cover the costs associated with issuing student identification cards. A replacement fee of \$25 is charged for misplaced or damaged cards.

White Coat Fee (§ 54.504)

A \$30 coat fee is collected from each student in the DO, PA & GSBS program during the first semester of enrollment to cover the cost associated with the White Coat Ceremony and the issuing of a white coat to each student.

Matriculation Fee (§ 54.504)

This \$25 fee is charged during the first semester of enrollment for each student entering a new degree program.

(Miscellaneous Fees)

Audit Fee (§ 54.504)

\$152.00 This fee may be waived for Senior citizens, full-time employees of UNT, UNT Health Science Center, or their spouses and dependents. Students auditing in a semester during which they are enrolled audit free.

Copy Card Fee (§ 54.504)

A \$150/yr copy card fee is charged to all 1st and 2nd year medical students to cover the cost of printing and copying on designated printers and copiers on campus.

International Student

Service Fee (§ 54.504)

A \$20 international student service fee is collected each semester from students that are not United States citizens or permanent residents. This fee defers costs related to providing services unique to this student population such as orientation programs, personal counseling regarding immigration rules and visa status, and other related issues.

Lab Fees (\$ 54.501)

A lab fee of \$25/year will be charged to 1st and 2nd year medical students and all PA students.

Late Registration Fee (\$ 54.504)

A flat fee of \$25 will be charged to students registering at any time during the designated late registration period.

Medical Malpractice**Insurance Fee (\$54.504)**

All Medical and PA students are required to carry medical malpractice insurance. The fee is \$200 per academic year.

Medical Services Fee (\$ 54.5081)

The fixed medical services fee is used solely to provide medical services to students registered at the health science center. The fee is \$67 per semester or \$200 per year.

Parking Fees (\$54.505)

Student parking permits are \$90 per year. Replacement permits will be issued at a charge of \$5 if the original is lost, stolen or destroyed.

Registration Reinstatement Fee (\$54.504)

Students who fail to make payment of tuition and fees by the payment deadline will be administratively withdrawn.

Registration may be reinstated upon appeal with a reinstatement fee of \$250.

Student Center (\$ 54.515)

This \$10/sem or \$30/year fee is collected for the maintenance and operation of the Student Lounges.

A \$100 graduation fee is required of all students who will receive a degree from the University of North Texas Health Science Center.

A \$20 filing fee is charged each time a student files a Declaration of Intent to Graduate form to cover administrative costs for preparing and mailing the graduation packet.

(Course Fees) (\$ 54.504)

Course fees vary from course to course. Course fees will be due at the time of registration or the payment deadline for early registered students. A full listing of course fees is available on pages 12-14 of this document.

Tuition and Fee Refunds (§ 54.006)

Class Drops

Refunds are made for any course dropped through the 12th class day for the long semester and through the fourth class day in the summer (see Academic Calendar for dates). The semester's first class day is always the first official day of classes for the respective school and not the first day of an individual's class. See the Academic Calendar in the respective school catalog for the date classes begin.

NOTE: If all classes for the semester are dropped, see "Schedule of Withdrawal Refunds" in this bulletin.

Withdrawal from School

A student who drops a course or withdraws from school within certain time periods may be entitled to a partial refund of tuition and fees. These refunds are calculated according to the category and time schedule listed below. Application fees, late registration charges, fee for student identification card, delinquent payment fees, and installment handling fees are non-refundable.

Withdrawal refunds are determined by the number of enrolled semester credit hours at the time of withdrawal. Withdrawal percentages are applied to the total amount of tuition and fees as prescribed by state law, not the amount paid. The withdrawal schedule and percentages of refund shown below pertain to total withdrawal for the semester. The withdrawal schedule and the percentages of refund are mandated by the Texas Legislature. The semester's first class day is always the first official day of classes and not the first day the individual attends class.

A withdrawal refund is based on the day of withdrawal relative to the first official day of classes, regardless of the date the class first meets. See the Academic Calendar in the respective school catalog for the date classes begin.

Schedule of Withdrawal Refunds

The UNT Health Science Center shall refund a percentage of tuition and mandatory fees to students withdrawing from the institution during a semester according to the following withdrawal schedule:

Fall or Spring Semester:

Before 1st day of class	100%
During 1st five class days	80%
During 2nd five class days	70%
During 3rd five class days	50%
During 4th five class days	25%
After 4th five class days	None

Summer Semester:

Before 1st day of class	100%
During 1st-3rd class days	80%
During 4th-6th class days	50%
Seventh day of class and thereafter	None

Any financial obligation to the health science center must be resolved before any refunds will be made.
