The IACUC provides assistance to investigators in fulfilling their obligation to plan and conduct animal experiments in accord with the highest scientific, humane, and ethical principles.

- Provide regulatory guidance on USDA and PHS animal research rules and regulations.
- Administrative support for IACUC activities and determinations.
- Manage regulatory aspects of animal research protocols.
- The Grants & Research Administration Management Suite (GRAMS) is used to assist investigators and research team members in the preparation and submission of their protocols & amendments.
