INTRODUCTION

These instructions contain information about the abstract submission process and represent a template for abstract formatting. All abstracts for the South Central ASB Regional Meeting must be submitted electronically to the TCOM Office of Associate Dean of Research at ODR@unthsc.edu. Please do not email abstracts to the chairs.

Abstract are due by 5 PM on Friday April 23rd. All abstracts must be submitted as PDF files. The author of an accepted abstract will be invited to give an oral or poster presentation at the conference.

The introduction should include background/context needed to support your hypotheses. Clearly state the general problem that you are addressing with this particular study.

(Between sections: keep the 10pt Times New Roman blank line)

METHODS

The abstract is limited to **one** page, with two columns of text. Left and right margins should be 0.5 inches, top and bottom margins should be 0.75 inches. Type font is Times New Roman or Times Roman 10 pt.

Briefly explain the methods that you used. For most abstracts, methods should be less than one third of the total amount of text.

(Between sections: keep the 10pt Times New Roman blank line)

RESULTS AND DISCUSSION

Be sure that you explain what your main result is, and how it adds to previous knowledge or compares to what was previously understood about the question that you are asking. If you had hypotheses, be sure to explain how your results support (or do not support) your hypotheses.




Figure 1: Figures or tables may be included. Ensure text is readable. Color can be used and will display in the online version of the abstract. Please don't go smaller than 9 point. **Tables** may span both columns.

SIGNIFICANCE

Explain the significance of your research. Here are some questions you can think about when you write this section: How are your results relevant to your field? How are they potentially impactful outside of your field? What is possible now, that was not possible? Will this impact clinical care? Will it change how people think about a particular problem? Think about, and comment upon, the broader perspective on your work.

Abstracts for the meeting must be submitted electronically via our website and received by April 23, 2021. In the event that a submission is incomplete or received after the submission deadline, the abstract will not be reviewed or considered for the conference program.

At the time of submission, please indicate your preference for a podium or poster presentation. If we are unable to accommodate your preference, your abstract will still be considered for other presentation types. Also, if a student is the first author, please indicate this on the abstract submission page of the website.

[2] References should include the necessary information to locate the reference

ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS

Acknowledgments are optional.

Formatting

The title (in bold caps), authors, and author affiliations should be centered across the top of the page.

Use numerical superscripts to distinguish authors from different institutions.

An email address of the corresponding author should be included. A web address of a department, laboratory or author may be included if desired.

Text within each section should be right and left justified, without paragraph indentations.

Please keep all Section headings and do not change them. Section headings should have their own line and not be part of the first paragraph.
