WHAT SHOULD I EXPECT DURING NEW STUDENT ORIENTATION?

You are about to embark on a new and exciting path in your life. The faculty, staff and current students are eagerly looking forward to providing resources and guidance to support your success.

New Student Orientation is mandatory for all incoming UNTHSC students. This is your opportunity to learn about academic and community expectations, campus culture, services and resources available to you. With that being said, we welcome your questions and full participation in all parts of the program!

You are also encouraged to start building relationships with your peers. Along with your family and friends, we understand that this is a vital part of your support network.

Orientation sessions will be held between 8:00 am and 5:00 pm. The number of days of orientation will vary depending on your program. In preparing to attend orientation, please consider the following:

- 1). **Punctuality:** Throughout your education and in your professional career, the habit of tardiness is one of the single most destructive traits you can possess. We ask that you be on time for orientation, every class, workshop, and meeting that you attend. It is a matter of courtesy to your fellow participants, orientation organizers, and session speakers. All orientation sessions are mandatory unless otherwise indicated. Failure to attend every session may result in dismissal.
- 2). **Attire:** Dress for orientation is usually business casual. Your schedule will indicate when business casual attire is not required. It is important that you comply with the UNTHSC student dress code at all times when on our campus or in off-site clinics.
- 3). **Please do not bring a spouse, parent, guest, child, etc. with you to orientation.** Orientation programs are designed for incoming students only. Any individual not accepted into a graduate program will be asked to leave.

4). Breakfast and lunch will generally be provided, including vegetarian options. See orientation schedules for details.

WHEN SHOULD I PURCHASE BOOKS?

Outside of certain college expenses where cost is “fixed”, the most expensive purchase that you will face is books (required or recommended). Booklists will be provided to you before classes begin [usually 2 – 4 weeks prior to the first day of class] UNTHSC does not have an on-campus bookstore. However, we do offer an Online Bookstore for students to purchase textbooks and UNTHSC merchandise: www.unthsc.bkstr.com

Here are a few guidelines which you may wish to consider as you purchase your textbooks: [1] The Online Bookstore usually has enough of the required textbooks in stock; [2] Consider buying used textbooks from current students at the beginning of each semester and [3] Don't be afraid to consult current students within your program for advice on textbooks and about the possibility of borrowing/buying their books.

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IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENTS & BACTERIAL MENINGITIS

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Immunization requirements of ALL UNTHSC [TCOM, GSBS, SPH, PA, DPT & Pharmacy] students are:

- Hepatitis B (Series or Titer)
- Hepatitis B (Titer)
- Measles, Mumps, Rubella (MMR)
- Varicella (Two Doses OR History of Disease OR Titer)
- Tetanus, Diphtheria, Acellular Pertussis (Tdap)
- Meningococcal (If under the age of 22)*
- Influenza
- Tuberculin Skin Testing
- Physical Examination

Proof of all immunizations must be uploaded onto the Mediat website (<https://unthsc.medicatconnect.com/>). Upon acceptance to UNTHSC, each student will receive an email from Mediat with instructions on creating an account. Once the account is created, the students can begin uploading proof of immunizations. Since UNTHSC is now using the Mediat website for all student immunizations, the students no longer have to submit records to the Student Health Clinic. Immunizations may also be provided at the Student Health Clinic and will be covered as outlined under the student's individual insurance plan.

Each year, the tuberculin skin tests and influenza vaccines are administered by the University. Proof of these immunizations will not be required until the University has administered them. If you have a history of a positive PPD, please schedule an appointment with the Student Health Clinic and bring all records with you, including most recent chest x-ray.

Students can visit the immunization website to find out what immunizations are required and how to submit documentation: <https://www.unthsc.edu/immunizations>. After classes have begun, students can obtain any needed vaccinations or screenings from the Student Health Clinic.

*documentation of **Meningococcal vaccination** must be received no later than 10 days before the first day of

class or students will be removed from their courses. Students who do not submit their immunization record by the deadline will not be allowed to attend classes for the semester.

Immunization requirements of ALL UNTHSC [TCOM, GSBS, SPH, PA, DPT & Pharmacy] students are:

- Hepatitis B Series
- Measles, Mumps, Rubella (MMR)
- Inactivated Polio (IPV)
- Diphtheria, Tetanus, Pertussis (Tdap)
- Varicella or evidence of chicken pox during childhood

Evidence of having received these immunizations may be made by either provision of an immunization record from the students' primary care provider, or by having titers drawn. Titers are blood tests that show whether you have immunity to a specific disease. Immunizations may also be provided at the Student Health Clinic, and will be covered as outlined under the student's individual insurance plan. Incoming students (those who are entering UNTHSC for the first time, or returning after being out for more than one fall or spring semester), are additionally required **as of January 1, 2012** to produce evidence of receipt of an initial bacterial meningitis vaccination dose or booster during the five-year period preceding the admission, and at least 10 days prior to the first day of the first semester in which they enroll. [More information and exceptions to the requirement for bacterial meningitis is listed on the Student Affairs website at <http://www.hsc.unt.edu/departments/registrar/MeningitisInformation.cfm>] Tuberculosis testing (PPD) is provided annually by the Student Health Clinic personnel at various times during the year. If you have a history of a positive PPD, please schedule an appointment with the Student Health Clinic and bring all records with you, including most recent chest x-ray.

Additional immunization requirements of TCOM, PA, DPT & Pharmacy students are:

If you are a TCOM, PA, DPT or Pharmacy student, you will also be required to have a complete history and physical within one year of matriculation. There will also need to be boosters related to the Tetanus, Diphtheria, Acellular Pertussis (Tdap) doses if you have not received these within the last two years.

WHEN WILL I GET MY EMAIL ACCOUNT?

Student email and network accounts are processed and created for all UNTHSC enrolled students based on the list provided by the Registrar's Office. You will receive your email and Network credentials at New Student Orientation.

UNTHSC uses hosted Microsoft Office 365 for student email and cloud storage space. Office 365 can be accessed via the most popular modern browsers and on the most common mobile device platforms at <http://web.unthsc.edu/office365> Office 365 email is the official method of communication at UNTHSC.

Should you experience any problems with your email account during or after NSO, contact the UNTHSC Helpdesk by phone at 817-735-2192, by email at hshelpdesk@unthsc.edu or in person at Library room 205. The Helpdesk hours for students are Monday – Friday 8:00 am to 9:00 pm.

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WHEN WILL I GET MY ID BADGE?

You will take your ID Badge Photo during New Student Orientation. It could take up to a week to receive your new ID badge. ID badges will not be distributed from the ID Badge office. The ID Badge office is located in the lobby of the Police Department located at the corner of Mattison and Montgomery across the street from the Medical Education Training (MET) building. The Badge office hours are Monday – Friday 8:30 am to 4:30 pm.

All replacement ID badges with a new photo are \$25. Any replacement, name or class change, using the current photo on file is \$20. Please note that a name or class change requires a signature from the Registrar's office.

Report if lost or stolen to the Police Department immediately. The card will be forced inactive until we are notified that the badge had been found or until a new one is made. If a badge is returned to the Police Department you will be notified via email that the badge is at the Police Department waiting to be picked up. 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LOCKERS

Lockers are available across campus and are handled by each academic program. Please contact your academic department to receive information regarding the locker reservation and assignment process.

UNTHSC lockers are available to all students. Lockers are located in the Carl E. Everett Education & Administration (EAD) building, Research and Education Building, and the Medical Education & Training (MET) building. Lockers are commonly used by students to store books, laptops, research materials, and lab items. During New Student Orientation, you will receive a locker request form via email with instructions on how to request a locker. Lockers are assigned on a first come first serve basis and are assigned within a week of submitting your request.

PARKING ON CAMPUS

A parking permit issued by the UNT Health Science Center Parking Office is required to be displayed on any vehicle parked on the University campus. Any vehicle that does not have a valid permit displayed risks being issued a parking citation.

Parking permits are required on all surface parking lots and garages. Permits are not valid in metered parking spaces.

Once registered, student information is provided to the Parking Office by the Registrar's Office, permits may be purchased online at <http://www.unt.edu/transit/HSCParking.html>. An additional permit may be purchased for a second vehicle as long as it is registered to the same household and proof is provided; however, only one vehicle at a time may be parked on campus. (It will be an automatic cancellation of parking privileges if additional parking permits are purchased and then given or sold to someone other than the purchasing party).

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**LEED Discount – The UNT Health Science Center Parking Office offers a 20% discount on full-price parking decals for drivers of low-emission and fuel-efficient vehicles. Low-emission and fuel-efficient vehicles are defined as vehicles that are either classified as Zero Emission Vehicles (ZEV) by the California Air Resources Board or have achieved a minimum green score of 40 from the American Council for an Energy Efficient Economy (ACEEE) annual vehicle rating guide. Effective September 1, 2017, we will no longer offer LEED discounts as the Office of Sustainability focuses on offering discount transit passes, BikeShare, installing electric car charging stations and considering other sustainable efforts for transportation.

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~~The vehicle must be listed on the current year rating guide. The discount is honored for annual parking permits when current insurance information (showing the student and vehicle listed) is provided in person to the parking office.~~

You will need your license plate number as well as the year, make, model and color of the vehicle (s) you wish to register whether you purchase your permit online or in the office. Payments will be accepted by cash, check or credit card.

Parking permits will need to be purchased each year as all permits expire August 31st. Garage access is granted only to those who purchase a permit. A parking permit does not guarantee a parking space, but allows parking if a space is available. Each vehicle operator is responsible for finding a legal space in the parking area designated by the permit they possess. Lack of space is not a valid excuse for violating any parking regulation.

UNTHSC assumes no responsibility for any vehicle or its contents while the vehicle is parked or operated on campus. All vehicle operators should lock and secure personal belongings out of site in their vehicles to deter theft or other criminal acts.

LIBRARY SERVICES

With quiet spaces for individual study, large study rooms available for reservation, and a collaborative floor with technology and furniture specifically customized for group work, Lewis Library can meet all of your study and research needs. An open computer lab is available on the main floor in the Library and the building is accessible with your badge 24/7 most days. Required textbooks and exam prep materials are available both in print and electronically. The Service Desk offers laptops, charging cables, as well as adapters for connecting to larger shared monitors.

The Library Research Services Office can assist with research, citation management, and other projects. Look for the "Ask Us" logo on the window on the main floor or reach out anytime at AskALibrarian@unthsc.edu. Lewis Library also hosts a number of programs and events, including Paws at Lewis Library which organizes visits by certified therapy dogs. STUDENT ACCOUNTING FINANCIALS

The Office of Student Finance and Cashiering Services Accounting is responsible for providing student account information, administering installment payment plans, collecting delinquent accounts, reporting IRS Form 1098T, and producing and distributing refunds including financial aid proceeds.

receiving payments for tuition and fees, installment payment plans, collection of delinquent accounts, IRS Form 1098T reporting, and delivering refunds as well as financial aid proceeds.

When will I receive my refund check?

You will receive an email during or after New Student Orientation from the Student Accounting Office indicating that your refund check is available for pick up or has been direct deposited to your bank account if you signed up for direct deposit. After receiving the email notice, you may pick up your check at the Cashier's Office located on the first floor of the Student Services Center, room 159. We ask all students to strongly consider signing up for direct deposit of your financial aid refunds. This is a faster, more secure way to receive your funds. No more waiting on the mail or being concerned with lost checks! Fill out your banking information securely thru your Student Center at my.hsc.unt.edu. Just fill in the bank routing number and your bank account number.

You will receive an email during or after New Student Orientation from the Student Finance Office regarding picking up your financial aid refund check. After receiving an email notice, you may pick up your check at the Cashier's Office located on the second floor of the Carl E. Everett Education and Administration (EAD) building, room 270. We ask all students to strongly consider signing up for direct deposit of your financial aid refunds. This is a faster, more secure way to receive your funds. No more waiting on the mail or being concerned with lost checks! Fill out your banking information securely thru your myHSC Student Portal. Just fill in the bank routing number and your bank account number.

When is tuition due?

Tuition is due by prior to the first day of classes. Payments are accepted in the following ways:

1. Online payments may be made 24 hours a day via the Student Center at my.hsc.unt.edu using American Express, Discover, MasterCard, Visa or E-check. Debit and credit card payments will be charged a 2.7% service charge.
2. Cash and check payments are accepted at the Cashier's Office, Student Services Center, Rm 159, Monday – Friday, 8:00 am to 5:00 pm.

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3. Checks may also be mailed; however, payments must be received by the due date and postmarks will not be considered. Please include your full name and student ID number on your check to insure proper credit. Cash payments via mail are not accepted.


