



Welcome to UNT Health Science Center, a place of innovative and transformative learning, research and patient care.


We are an institution made up of Extraordinary Teams fiercely devoted to **transforming lives in order to improve the lives of others.**

Session Topics

The Care Team

HSC cares about our students' success, not only academically, but emotionally and physically. Because of our commitment, we provide services across campus that respond to our students' unique needs. Students can meet with a member of the Care Team in order to learn about applicable resources and create some action items surrounding their specific needs. The Care Team is an especially helpful resource when students are unsure of their path forward and/or are still learning the resources of the HSC and the greater community.

The Care Team often works alongside other offices within the campus community, such as the Office of Student Affairs, Center for Academic Performance, and the HSC Police Department, with the common purpose to provide the best support and resources for students' success.

Center for Academic Performance (CAP)

The Center for Academic Performance is committed to helping HSC students meet their personal and academic goals. We offer services designed to enhance all levels of academic performance whether you attend classes on campus or online. In this session, we will discuss all of the services available and ways we can partner to ensure your success.

Dual Degree at HSC

The HSC offers dual-degree programs uniquely tailored to the educational needs of students who wish to integrate medical training with research or public health. Faculty from multiple schools will discuss programs including DO/MS, DO/PhD, DO/MPH, PharmD/MPH, and MPAS/MPH.





Financial Aid

The Financial Aid Office will be providing information on how to apply for Financial Aid, awarding time frame, basic loan information and contact information.

Health Insurance

All students are required to have health insurance and must obtain and maintain health insurance coverage while enrolled at the UNT Health Science Center. New student enrollment and waiver of insurance information will be provided during orientation. Insurance coverage must meet the minimum standards as outlined by the federal government’s Affordable Care Act.





Interprofessional Education (IPE)

The purpose of Interprofessional Education (IPE) is to prepare health professions students for Interprofessional Practice by teaching collaborative practice competencies within the context of Interprofessional Teams. In this session, we will discuss what the IPE curriculum looks like across our multiple programs and its focus to educate our students on values & ethics, communication, teamwork, and roles & responsibilities.

Student Engagement

The Office of Student Development builds community and develops experiences that encourage and support student success. We provide a range of services, which include coordinating institutional events, planning new student orientation, developing leadership programs, supporting diversity, equity and inclusion initiatives, overseeing student governments and organizations and collaborating with campus partners. We look forward to helping you feel connected at HSC!





Student Finance

The Office of Student Finance is responsible for student accounts, including but not limited to providing information about tuition and fees, student bills, collects amounts owed to the university, payment options, Third Party Contract billing, student refunds, and reporting of IRS 1098T tax information. We collaborate with other student service departments on campus to process waivers, exemptions and short term loans. In addition to serving students, Student Finance

oversees the Cashier Office which disburses student refund checks, accepts student payments, processes department deposits, simulated patient fund request and department petty cash funds.

White Coat Information

With a grant from the Arnold P. Gold Foundation of New York, The University of North Texas Health Science Center at Fort Worth began the celebration of a White Coat Ceremony in August 1996. The White Coat Ceremony is a “rite of passage” for Health Science Center students that encourages a psychological contract for professionalism and empathy. The event emphasizes the importance of the foundational mission of the Institution: education, research, patient care and service.

The HSC ceremony takes place at Will Rogers Memorial Auditorium in front of family, friends and faculty. Incoming TCOM, PA, PT and SCP students are welcomed by the President, Provost, Deans and prominent leaders in the healthcare industry. The students are then presented, “cloaked,” with their first white coats symbolizing the mantle of their

chosen profession. Students swear a professional oath before the assembled group, publicly acknowledging their new responsibilities and their willingness to assume the obligations of their new profession.

The white coat is a symbolic, non-verbal communication used to express and reaffirm a fundamental belief in a system that society observes. The authority of dress is serious and purposeful, not social, casual or random. The dress of healers of primitive societies was an important part of the paraphernalia of healing. The uniform should imply a purely professional interest. It must convey to even the most anxious a sense of seriousness and purpose that helps provide reassurance and confidence that his/her complaints will be dealt with competently and seriously.

It is a cloak of compassion.




