Major responsibilities include oversight of interventions and services for HIV+ individuals within the Project CONNECT Program including Intensive Linkage to Medical Care, Comprehensive Risk Counseling Services (CRCS) and the Behavioral Health program for individuals with mental health and/or substance use disorders. The candidate will provide direct supervision to the Linkage to Care Specialists, CRCS Risk Reduction Specialist, and Behavioral Health Case Managers. The candidate must be culturally competent and experienced in working with diverse populations within a human services field, such as social work, psychology, counseling or public health; skilled in assessment techniques and crisis intervention; knowledgeable of HIV/STD risk behaviors, human sexuality, substance abuse, and HIV behavior change strategies. The candidate must demonstrate strong written and verbal communication abilities. The position requires the ability to work a flexible work schedule including early mornings, evenings, and weekend hours. The candidate will be required to use his/her own vehicle for transportation to pertinent project related events, must be able to drive up to 75 miles one way outside the Dallas County area and must have a valid driver's license and appropriate automobile insurance. Requirements include a master's degree in social work, psychology or counseling or related field and two years experience in a relevant field, preferably related to HIV/AIDS, mental health and substance abuse and demonstrated supervisory experience. Key responsibilities include assisting HIV+ clients with medical treatment adherence and accessing mental health and substance abuse services; conducting comprehensive needs/resource assessments of assigned clients; developing a care plan based on the assessment of needs, barriers, and resources; conducting group support and education sessions for clients in treatment for mental health and substance abuse. This position involves working closely with medical, mental health and substance abuse providers as well as other resources in the community. The candidate must be culturally competent and experienced in working with diverse populations within a human services field, such as social work, psychology, counseling or public health; skilled in assessment techniques and crisis intervention; knowledgeable of HIV/STD risk behaviors, human sexuality, mental health and substance abuse disorders, and HIV behavior change strategies. The candidate must demonstrate strong written and verbal communication abilities and have the ability to work with both individuals and groups.
