Element 6.6:

In each year of the curriculum, a COM and any branch campus must provide each student with instruction in osteopathic principles and practice (OPP), including both observation and hands-on application of osteopathic manipulative medicine (OMM) supervised by COM-credentialed DO or MD.

Procedure Statement: TCOM shall integrate osteopathic philosophy, principles and practices including didactic and hands-on opportunities within each year of the curriculum. **Procedure Responsible Party** TCOM shall identify the cognitive and psychomotor competencies Senior Associated Dean for unique to the practice of osteopathic manipulative medicine that Academic Affairs must be acquired by all students through the four-year curriculum. Chair of Family Medicine and OMM **OMM Faculty** 2. Learning opportunities for osteopathic principles and practice, TCOM Curriculum Committee osteopathic manipulative medicine, and osteopathic manipulative TCOM Course Directors treatment shall be assigned to each of the years of training as is TCOM Clerkship Directors appropriate for the level of student development. 3. TCOM courses shall integrate training in OPP and OMM to the TCOM Curriculum Committee TCOM Course Directors extent possible. 4. The TCOM osteopathic curriculum shall include supervised clinical TCOM Curriculum Committee observation and practice. TCOM shall monitor the success of its curriculum in osteopathic 5. Senior Associate Dean for Academic manipulative medicine through student performance on internal Affairs assessments and COMLEX Levels 1, 2 and 3. 6. The college shall review its curriculum in osteopathic manipulative TCOM Curriculum Committee medicine at least annually to assure compliance with this TCOM Executive Committee procedure and general attainment of student competence.
