COCA Element 9.3 Transfer Policies	Revised: February 2024

Element 9.3:

A COM must publish and follow policies regarding transfer or admissions with advanced standing. A COM may only accept credits from a school accredited by the COCA or the Liaison Committee on Medical Education (LCME) where the student is eligible for readmission. The COM must ensure that if transfer occurs from an LCME accredited school of medicine, the student must acquire OMM/OPP competency prior to graduation from the COM. The last two years of education must be completed at the COM granting the degree.

Procedure Statement: Students enrolled in colleges or schools accredited by the Council on Osteopathic College Accreditation (COCA) or the Liaison Committee on Medical Education (LCME) are eligible to apply for admission to TCOM. Such candidates may be eligible for advanced standing upon transfer at the discretion of the TCOM Dean.

	granting of credit for coursework previously completed or in

	accepted for credit by TCOM.		
4.	The assignment of credit hours for coursework completed at	HSC Registrar	
	another institution shall be governed by the policies of HSC, UNTS,

5.	TCOM shall establish such other criteria for transfer as is deemed	Assistant Dean, Admissions

6.	Admitted transfer students must successfully complete at least	TCOM Academic Affairs HSC Registrar	
	two years of instruction at TCOM and all other published		
	requirements to be eligible to receive the Doctor of Osteopathic		
	Medicine (D.O.) degree. This shall include the acquisition of		
	competency in OMM/OPP as required of all students.		
7.	All policies regarding application for transfer shall be reviewed	Assistant Dean, Admissions HSC Registrar TCOM Dean HSC Provost UNTS Regents	
	annually and published in the HSC catalog. All policy changes in		
	this regard shall be submitted to the TCOM Dean, the HSC Provost		
	and the UNT System Board of Regents for approval. Policy changes		
	shall be published one year in advance of their implementation in		
	accordance with Texas Education Code 51.842.
